Edinburgh is well connected by **bus and train**, making it easy to explore the city and surrounding areas without a car. Using public transport helps reduce carbon emissions, traffic, and noise while supporting services relied upon by local residents.

Arriving in Edinburgh By Train

- **Three main railways stations in Edinburgh, Haymarket station, waverly Station and Edinburgh Gateway**
- The Best way to get to the hotel via our closest train station Haymarket is by taking the number 26 bus located right outside the train station. The bus stop is then a 3 minute walk to the hotel

Getting Around Edinburgh by Bus

Edinburgh has an extensive bus network connecting:

- City centre attractions
- Museums, parks, and shopping areas
- Surrounding neighbourhoods and heritage sites
